The Charnley-Norwood Summer Cottage Complex was built in 1890 as a vacation residence for Chicago lumber-baron James Charnley and was designed by two of America's greatest architects—Louis Sullivan, who is known as the "father of the skyscraper" and Frank Lloyd Wright, often called the father of modern architecture". The main house apparently burned in 1897, but was rebuilt and improved upon by Sullivan for another Chicago businessman, Fredrick Norwood. In their designs. Sullivan and Wright rejected the details common to Victorian architecture in favor of experimentation with forms that later become the hallmarks of modern architecture. The Charnley-Norwood Summer Cottage Complex represents a watershed in residential design and affords historians a glimpse at the evolutionary forces that powerfully reshaped American residential architecture in the 20th century. In addition to its historical importance, the Charnley-Norwood House, which once contained extensive gardens, also possesses natural features significant to the ecology of the Gulf Coast. * (Mississippi Department of Archives & History) The Charnley-Norwood House is a public building that was built original in 1890 and restoration was completed May 2013. The property is located at 509 East Beach, Ocean Springs, Mississippi. Property consist of 2.38 acres located in Jackson County, Mississippi, Parcel number 60132220.00 and is zoned R-1 (Single Family Resident). The site is owned and managed by the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources under the Mississippi Gulf Coast National Heritage Area program and will be maintained in a long-term agreement with the Mississippi Department of Archives and History and local government. Property acquisition was funded by the Coastal Impact Assistance Program and property restoration was funded by a Hurricane Relief Grant Program for Historic Preservation through the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. Under the terms set forth in the acquisition and restoration the property must be used for conservation and preservation of its natural and historical features and must be maintained as a natural area and historic architectural characteristics and features and of its ecological integrity and associated habitats and for compatible purposes.
